Labor Day Weekend



We had another great week in Ms. Watson's Class! Last week we learned how to effectively use our Literature Webs to dive deeper into the complex texts that we read. We will be using this TD resource (from William and Mary's Center for Gifted Education) throughout the year. We read a text as a class and completed each section, making sure to carefully go over expectations for each part. Your child has these in their notebooks, and should use them as a resources when completing their Reading Homework. Ms. Parotta's class heard about how much fun we were having, and decided to come join us for one of the lessons!

Happening This Week...

Math

This week students will be working on topic 1: comparing decimals from greatest to least, and rounding decimals. Their weekly homework is due to Mrs. Barbeau on Friday. Please look over their homework to make sure your child is grasping each skill! If you have any questions, do not hesitate to reach out to Mrs. Barbeau.

Reading

This week, we will be starting our William and Mary Perspectives Concept-Based Unit. We will complete a TABA lesson in which students will explore examples, non examples, and misconceptions of perspective, and then take that learning to a higher level by creating generalizations about perspective. We will then focus on perspective and how the concept is portrayed in literature.

Content

Science- This week, we will be learning about extreme weather and what causes it to occur. We will explore this further through a Problem Based Learning STEM activity... get excited! Pics to come! Social Studies- We will begin our Native American unit, learning about the very first Americans and how they adapted to their environments.
