Plot Diagram

What are the components of a plot diagram?

First we need the...

Introduction/Background/Beginning

Then comes the...

Rising action

Next is the...

Conflict

Climax

After that, it's the...

Falling Action

And finally, we (hopefully) have the...

Resolution/Conclusion

Introduction

- beginning of the story

- where characters and setting is revealed

Rising Action

-events leading up to the conflict, or problem in the story

Conflict

the problem, or challenge, faced by the character(s)

Climax (crisis)

the middle or most important action of the story; turning point

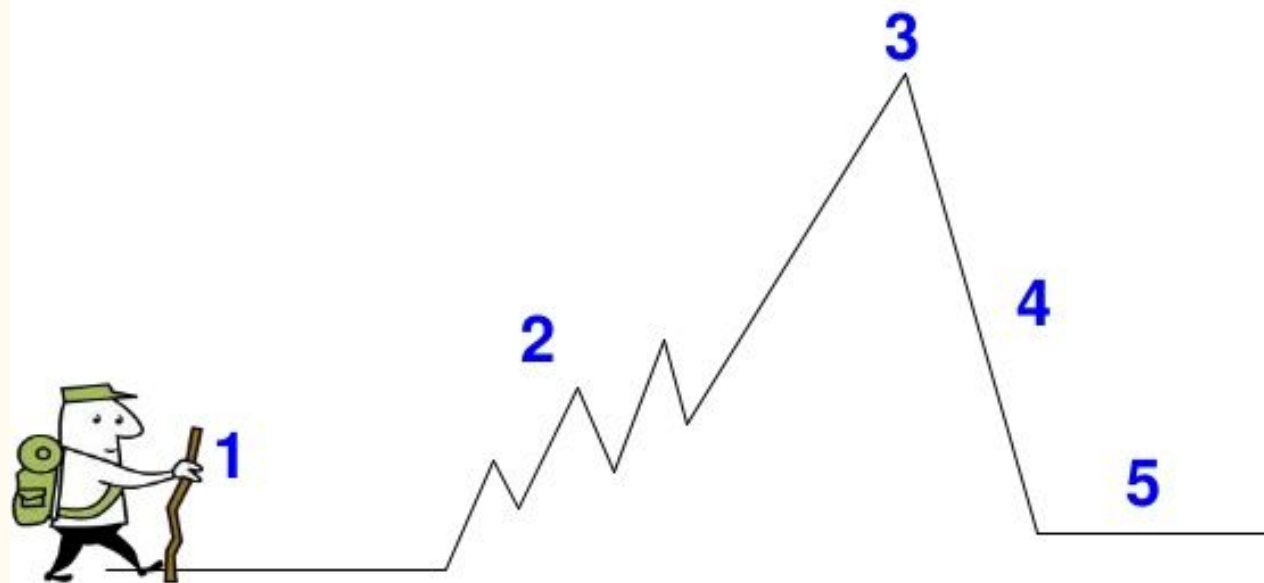
Falling Action

shorter section that follows the climax and goes to the end;
events begin to resolve

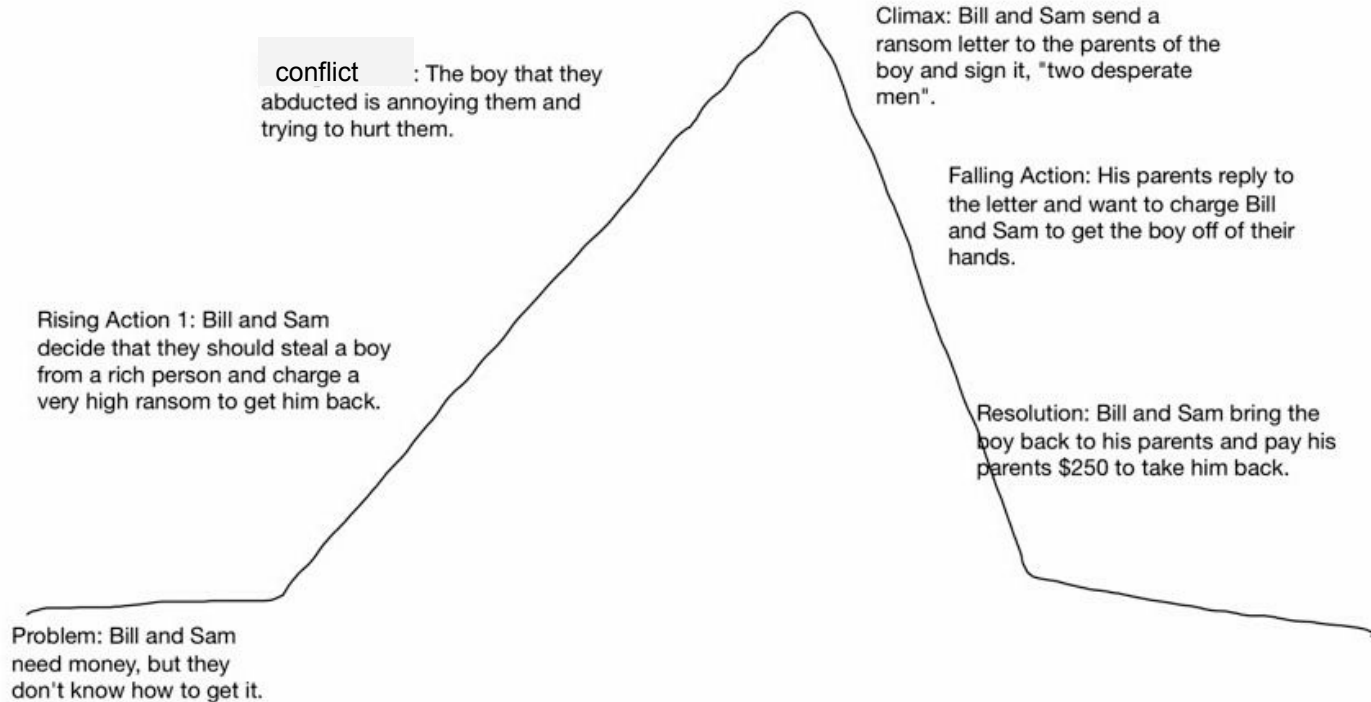
Conclusion

when the conflict is resolved and the reader sees closure to the story
