Directions: Each week during the month of October, you must earn a total of 100 points by choosing to complete the assignments below. It is up to you which assignments you complete, as long as it adds up to 100 points! Keep in mind, this should be done with a fictional story, as that is what we are reading in class currently! **\*\*ALL ACTIVITIES SHOULD BE COMPLETED ON LINED/WHITE PAPER AND STAPLED TOGETHER WHEN TURNING IN EACH FRIDAY, and each page has the title of the activity you completed with the date in the corner of the page.** These will be due each Friday!

<p><b>Plot Diagram</b> <b>30 pts</b></p> <p>Complete a plot diagram for a book you are reading this week. See the format here: <a href="#">Plot Diagram Format</a></p>	<p><b>The Sequel</b> <b>80 pts</b></p> <p>Pretend the author wrote a sequel to the book or novel you are reading. Create the book cover. Write the first chapter of this sequel. Your chapter should be at least 5 journal/notebook pages long.</p>	<p><b>Movie Poster</b> <b>40 pts</b></p> <p>Pretend your book was turned into a movie. Design the movie poster. Describe in 6-8 sentences how the movie would be different from the book. What pieces would you not include? Why are you cutting them from the movie?</p>	<p><b>Comic Strip</b> <b>20 pts</b></p> <p>Create a comic strip showing the events from all or part of your book. Your comic strip must include at least 5 major events from the book or portion of the book you are using.</p>
<p><b>Making Connections</b> <b>10 pts</b></p> <p>Make 3 connections between something that is happening in your book with something from your life, another book, or the world around you. For each connection, you must write 3-5 sentences about the connection you made and why you made that connection.</p>	<p><b>Interview the Author</b> <b>20 pts</b></p> <p>Write 6-8 questions that you would like to ask the author of your book. Think about what you are still wondering about and what you would like to learn more about. At the end write 5-7 sentences about what made you want to ask these particular questions.</p>	<p><b>Conflicts in History</b> <b>100 points</b></p> <p>Research a famous conflict in history and analyze it according to the types of conflicts learned in class or choose one type of conflict and find examples in history. Create a visual representation of your research and present to class (Prezi, google slides doc, ppt, newspaper article).</p>	<p><b>Award Time</b> <b>20 points</b></p> <p>What award would you give this story? Create an award for this story and explain your reasoning behind it. Be creative!</p>
